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V. TEACHING

Brief Description of Teaching Activities: Curriculum Development and Instruction.

Introduction: As a new faculty member in 2005, I had many student variables to consider when redesigning my program. I found the hybrid model of online teaching provides the best of both educational worlds. All of the online and hybrid courses listed below have been created since 2005 to expand the program to the rural areas in Tennessee and also to meet the needs of the non-traditional student returning to obtain a teaching credential. This list of hybrid/online courses are continually updated and modified to incorporate new information, new technology, webinars, and related community projects to expand the learning environment. Hybrid classes are combined with community service-learning projects to provide real world experiences for the students.

FCSE 1400: Personal Finance. This three credit fully online course (D2L) provides foundational knowledge and related skills for young adults who are soon to be involved in personal financial decisions on their own. Key concepts in this course include how career choices, education, skills, life stage and economic conditions affect income; how to apply a decision-making process to personal finance choices; how to compare the benefits and costs of spending decisions with an emphasis on credit management; and how to examine investment and saving alternatives. Relevant activities include an historical analysis of money; designing a personal financial plan; utilizing a checking and savings account; and comparing and contrasting credit management studies. This class can be delivered as a dual enrollment course for secondary students or for college credit.

FCSE 2510: Family and Consumer Sciences Vocational Education and Curriculum. This three-credit experiential-learning, hybrid course (D2L) presents an overview of the philosophy, career and technical legislation, federal and state educational regulations, standards, co-curricular youth programs, and curriculum in formal and non-formal programs in the field of family and consumer sciences. Students will collaborate on a community service learning project to understand how the school and community impact the curricula. Diversity, equality, and the special needs of students will be emphasized. Understanding life-long learning and management concepts for professional growth will be included. This course is taught in a computer lab. This course is taught in the spring semester only.

FCSE 3510: Methods and Materials for Teaching Family and Consumer Sciences. This three-credit experiential-learning, hybrid course (D2L) focuses on the factors influencing family and consumer sciences education in the past and present, components of a learning environment, principles of teaching/learning, and curriculum construction applied to the field. Podcasts, chat rooms, service learning projects with secondary education programs, and outreach efforts with other community agencies compliment the course. The course is taught in a computer lab in the fall semester.

HSC 1010: Career Orientation. This one credit course (enhanced by D2L) introduces freshman and sophomores to the development and scope of the human sciences as a profession. An interactive CD- Rom activity assists students in establishing goals, and charting individual plans for personal development and professional success. Professionalism, ethics, decision making, and basic library and research skills are introduced. The library research activity, SearchPath, was added to enhance the focus on research. SearchPath has five interactive modules with corresponding quizzes. This course is taught both fall and spring semesters.

HSC 3430: Housing. This three-credit online course (D2L) focuses on the evaluation of housing and equipment in terms of family needs, economics, building codes, legislation, and technological developments. Housing alternatives presented and analyzed with emphasis on socio-psychological satisfaction with the residence. Student projects are linked to local planning departments and with the Federal Housing Authority. This course is taught in the spring semester only.

HSC 4000: Senior Seminar. This one credit course hybrid course (D2L) involves an examination of the various processes and skills necessary to be successful in developing and managing your career. Using a learning contract, students will create measurable goals and outcomes for themselves that will form the basis for the individualized work accomplished this semester. Career development skills including resume and cover letter construction, interviewing skills, leadership, decision making, networking, and life/work planning skills will be incorporated. A global perspective in the field of family and consumer sciences will be introduced with other topics such as ethics, professionalism, and creating a winning attitude.

Students will participate in a career fair or professional networking activity as one of the course requirements. This course is taught every semester.

HSC 4410/HSC 5410: Consumer Economics. This three-credit online course (D2L) considers the various theories of economics as related to the family, and presents an overview of the choices available and the decision-making process confronting the family in the American economy. The course is a requirement for most majors in the human sciences department and has been converted to a fully online D2L class to meet the needs of the students. This course is taught both fall and spring semesters.

HSC 4420/5420: Personal and Family Management. This three-credit online course (D2L) provides the opportunity to identify and integrate the management functions of the human sciences areas. As well as putting emphasis on management roles and responsibilities of the human sciences professionals, the relationship of the learning organization concept to the human science profession, and the use of quality improvement techniques to solve human sciences-related problems. This course is taught in the spring semester only.

YOED 4110: Directed Teaching, Grades 7-12. This is a full-semester supervised teaching experience in a Tennessee secondary classroom with another cooperating teacher from the school and a student teacher. Generally, the student will have two rotations: one in a middle school and one in a high school. This course is taught both fall and spring semesters.

NFS 3100: Food and Culture in the United States. This three-credit online course (D2L) begins with the exploration of the history of foods in the United States and the influences from other cultures, history, industry and economics. Areas of focus will be historical events that influenced the food supply and introduction of new foods, changes and inventions that changed the way food was produced and prepared in the home, economic conditions that affected food supply and the changes in nutritional value due to processing and preparation methods. As we become a more culturally diverse country, we will look at the ways we adopt and accept foods from other cultures and incorporate them into our culture and how they are regionalized in the United States. Also included will be food production, cost and the impact it will have on the American family in the future. This online course is part of the Culinary Arts Occupational Endorsement (TN State Licensing Code #452) for secondary teachers.

NFS 4100/5100: Food Service Management for Culinary Arts. This three-credit class will explore the management process of the food service industry. Areas of study include an overview of food and beverage operations; facility design; food service job descriptions and responsibilities; business and financial skills related to purchasing and receiving in a food service establishment; food service marketing; menu planning; cost and pricing strategies; internal and external customer service and nutritional concerns.

NFS 6100: Advanced Studies in Food and Culture in the United States.

This course provides students with specialized knowledge and practical skills relating to the complex interactions between food and culture from a global perspective. Modules 1-4 will focus on concepts that are key to the foundation of food and culture, the effects of cultural factors on dietary practices, the importance of diet as a cause and a solution to the global burden of malnutrition and obesity, and lastly, the current developments in healthy and sustainable dietary guidelines. Strategies for addressing some of the challenges that impact the future of food and culture will be emphasized in the last module. This is a fully online course.
